To add to its success, this past year, Alejandro created the first ever **Loisaida Basketball Tournament**, that positively engaged over 400 LES youth and their families, as a part of the Loisaida Festival's key intergenerational activities.

Alejandro's interdisciplinary expertise, creative approach to media production, and his problem solving skills, have been a catalyst for many of the organization's successful efforts, such as the **Loisaida Artistic Residency Program**, acclaimed **Loisaida Exhibitions** -- various featured in the New York Times, and most recently, the **Loisaida Digital Learning Lab**, the organization's new multimedia technology and audio-visual arts production Hub, have paved the way for his well-deserved ascension.
